The Course offers practical training and skills in sustainable living. We will cover design principles and technologies that you can easily apply to your home, apartment, property, farm, workplace, and community to help you live well in the city or the country.

Who: Professionals/amateurs: homeowners, apartment dwellers, gardeners, farmers, land owners, developers, architects/designers, teachers – Visitors and Islanders.
